From the Desk of the Rabbi

When our family moved to Tokyo in 2006 our youngest daughter Mayim was just 12 months old. We knew it was going to be an adventure. We settled into our apartment and I was in the large and expansive hallway walking along with Mayim, when we came upon a couple and their young baby who looked to be around the same age as Mayim. Their names were Gretchen and Michael and their daughter Madeline was indeed just a few weeks younger than Mayim. It turns out they were to be our neighbors for the next few years and as luck would have it they were Jewish. We had the unique experience of being able to celebrate Shabbat and the Jewish holidays with them even while we were so far away from home, and any semblance of a normal Jewish community that we had become accustomed to growing up in the United States. They were some of our dearest friends, and Mayim and Madeline have remained close all these years - from toddling down the hallways of our apartment building to attending Hebrew School at the Jewish Community of Japan where I was their Hebrew School teacher. Japan holds for us and for them a unique blend of being outsiders in Japan and a tightness and an embrace of cultivating some of our most incredible and spiritual moments of our Jewish identity. For both Mayim and Madeline, their Jewish souls began to develop in the land of the rising sun.

This past week, our journey continued when we stopped to see Gretchen and Michael and their three kids on our way home from our vacation. Michael's

parents, whom we met many times in Tokyo were also there. At dinner, we began discussing an idea we had years ago to celebrate Mayim and Madeline as a double bat mitzvah. Michael and Gretchen proceeded to tell us that they have decided to go back to Japan for Madeline's bat mitzvah and do a small ceremony of some kind there. They invited us to join them. "Why Japan?", I asked. That wouldn't be something I would think of to do as a destination for a bat mitzvah. And Michael said, "That was where Madeline spent her first years. It is her first Jewish home as well." I felt as though I was sitting at the crossroads of where the past intersects with the future. Pleasing the previous generation's sense of meaningful ritual and customs vs. our generation's tendency toward finding new and innovative rituals that mean something to us. Throwing the establishment out the window and instead creating new rituals that do not seek the approval of the prior generation.

All of this talk of old and new, traditional and non-traditional, made me consider one of the messages of this week's Torah portion, Eikev, which is like a walk down memory lane for the Israelites. Moses recalls how he smashed the tablets on his way down the mountain after receiving the Torah. He then tells the Israelites how God told him to carve out two tablets of stone, like the first. And then the Rabbis do an interesting thing. The Sfat haEmet teaches that by smashing the tablets Moses saved them from themselves.

It is as if the only way to holiness is to smash the "things" we thought were the source of sacred power. In fact, the rabbis teach that Moses not only deposited the *new* set of tablets into the ark of the covenant, but he placed the shards, the broken pieces of the tablets he smashed alongside the new tablets. Tradition teaches us that these smashed tablets journeyed with the Israelites and possessed the same holiness. It does not say this explicitly in the Torah, but rather, by reading into the text. Rabbi Yosef recorded in the Talmud translates, "And you shall place "them" in the ark, "them" meaning both the broken set and the newly carved out tablets. The old with new. Smashing our ideas of tradition, yet keeping the core ideas and values as we venture off to find new, meaningful rituals.

Our twenty four hour stop in Lewes, DE, ironically the "first town in the first state", didn't only conjure up old memories of our times in Tokyo. The most incredible thing happened. During their last year in Tokyo, Gretchen and Michael had their third child, a daughter, Isabel. Over breakfast, Gretchen shared with us that Isabel never had a baby naming. As I had also done their son's naming, we started talking about the possibility of having Isabel's baby naming that very morning at the beach. I started making lists of Hebrew names, and all of the kids had an opinion, so we decided that Isabel Rose would now be known among her people as Yardena Rae. Within minutes, the kids changed into fresh clothes and helped 5 year old Isabel with her hair and clothes. We had a checklist: a pitcher to pour water over Isabel's feet, a small chair for Elijah, and a matching chair for Isabel to sit in. It had started to sprinkle so we all set out the 50 feet to the beach. You should have seen us. Thirty minutes before we had been sitting around in our pajamas having breakfast, and as fate would have it, an ordinary moment became one of the most spontaneous, extra-ordinary, precious and meaningful jewish rituals that will forever be imprinted on our and our childrens' hearts

and minds. All ten of us who bore witness to this naming had the chance to pour a bit of water over Isabel's feet, with Grandma having the first honor. As we poured the water over her tiny, active feet in the sand we each poured over her a blessing as well. "May you have a life of adventure", "May you have best days every day", "I wish you luck when you start school this year", "May you have a life of mystery and spirit."

As we walked back to the house a bit dampened by the rain, our spirits soared with the wind. Madeline, Mayim's beloved 10 yr old friend came up alongside me and said, "My mom told me that my baby naming was in New York City in a big beautiful synagogue with lots of people and a luncheon after it, but you know what? My mom just told me that this naming ceremony was more special. And she said it with a huge smile."

We all took turns washing the sand off of our feet from the beach - the very same sand that clung to the feet of our ancestors as they journeyed through the wilderness thousands of years ago.

As we approach the High Holy Days, I am reminded of how precious and meaningful Jewish rituals can be. We may think that just because we celebrate the Holy Days in much the same manner as we have been doing for hundreds and hundreds of years, that they will be rote and empty. This summer has taught me that it is up to each of us to infuse meaning and intention into the Holy Days. To approach old rituals with new life, to bring our own creativity and experiences with us as we stand together as a community. My own experiences have informed my ever-inclusive understanding of Judaism and how it can make meaning in our lives. This following D'var Torah helped me to see how incredibly powerful ancient Jewish rituals can be in our modern lives.
