Chai - What Can I Do For You Today?

The number eighteen (chai), reflects Judaism's focus on the importance of life. It also has special personal significance for me this month. It is my honor and pleasure to have served as your rabbi for the past eighteen months. And I very much look forward to the next eighteen months and beyond. Exciting signs of new energy, if not infinite possibility, continue to emerge in Rochester and at Temple Beth David.

But does this apply in February? In Rochester? At Temple Beth David? Yes! For starters, February 2nd is Groundhog Day, which reminds me of one of my favorite movies, the 1993 Harold Ramis film, Groundhog Day. In case you haven't seen it in awhile (or ever), the movie is about a weatherman named Phil Connors (played by Bill Murray) who lives Groundhog Day over and over and over again. Egotistical and sarcastic weatherman Phil is sent to Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania to report on whether or not Punxsutawney Phil, the groundhog, "sees his shadow," and returns to his burrow, signifying that there will be another six weeks of winter.

Caught in a kind of science fiction-like time loop, Phil wakes up every morning in Punxsutawney on Groundhog Day to Sonny and Cher endlessly singing "I Got You Babe" on his clock radio. He is the only one who knows this is happening. Phil goes through cycles of dismay,



hedonism, despair, and selfdestructive recklessness until he decides to learn how to be a mentsch. He discovers that developing a "what can I do for you today" attitude makes him a lot happier than the "what can I do to you today" attitude he displaces.

Professional movie reviewers explain Phil's transformation in so many ways that the movie seems to operate as a Rorschach test. It's very possible to understand the movie as a man's decision to realize his self-potential or a person learning to see the "angel" or the Divine spark in another person or possibly an individual switching from one who always sees the glass as half empty to one who sees it as half full.

Each interpretation of the movie, like a snowflake, and like each one of us, is unique. It depends upon where we are in our lives. We do not have to live the same day of our lives over and






