From the Desk of the Rabbi

By the time this Bulletin reaches you, it will be 2015. For me, it means that two years have passed since I moved back to the United States from Japan. In that time, I have had the incredible opportunity to meet the people of Temple Beth David and learn, first hand, about its history, generations of family history and their relationships to the Temple. And of course, I have heard all about the building of Temple Beth David.

In the two years that I have been in Rochester, I have found a Jewish community that is warm and welcoming and excited to learn and to celebrate. A congregation who comforts its mourners, and a community that supports social justice causes.

As all of you now know, our building is for sale and a potential move is on the horizon. I can't go anywhere without being asked by someone in the community whether or not we have found a new location, or what is going to happen to Temple Beth David. Questions have come from congregants as well as others in the community. And for the most part, the question is filled with a bit of apprehension. It is so difficult for our congregants to think of leaving their beloved home, even at some point in the future. And for the Rochester Jewish community, our move

signals that change is afoot in general. Not many people like change.

An article I read in *The Huffington Post*, written by Heidi Grant Halvorson, Ph.D., entitled "Explained: Why We Don't Like Change" delves into the reasons behind our often unconscious assumption that that which has been around longer must be better. Dr. Halvorson writes:

"It's not just that people fear change, though they undoubtedly do. It's also that they genuinely believe (often on an unconscious level) that when you've been doing something a particular way for some time, it must be a good way to do things. And the longer you've been doing it that way, the better it is.

So change isn't simply about embracing something unknown -- it's about giving up something old (and therefore good) for something new (and therefore not good).

The bottom line is, unconsciously we all believe that longevity = goodness. There are, admittedly, plenty of instances where this is perfectly rational. When a particular product or way of doing things has stood the test of time, it is probably superior to alternatives in at least some respects.

In one study, people who saw a painting described as having been painted in

1905 found it far more pleasing to look at than people who saw the same painting described as created in 2005. In another, they admired the appearance of a tree described as being 4,500 years old more than did those who thought the same tree just 500 years old.

In my favorite example, study participants were given a piece of European chocolate. It was described to them as having first been sold in its region either 73 years ago or 3 years ago. Guess which group rated the chocolate as better-tasting."

Although I found Halvorson's study to

be accurate, for someone like me, who has moved all over the world, change = good. If moving around has taught me anything, I have learned that people create foundations and communities, and buildings do not. Relationships build structure and embrace us, bricks do not. In the years we spent abroad, our home was wherever we happened to live at that time. Home, was the people we surrounded ourselves with. And because of that amazing lesson we learned, we never yearned for a physical structure. We missed our families back home, but not our house. When I think about our life in Japan, for all of the beauty that exists

in that country, it is the friendships that I miss most of all.

The brick and mortar of a community are the relationships and purpose that we create through our shared experience.

The Rochester Jewish Community is making unprecedented strides towards change and Temple Beth David, I believe, will move from strength to strength no matter where our path takes us.

As the Jewish saying goes, "*Mishana makom, mishana mazal*". You change your place, you change your luck."

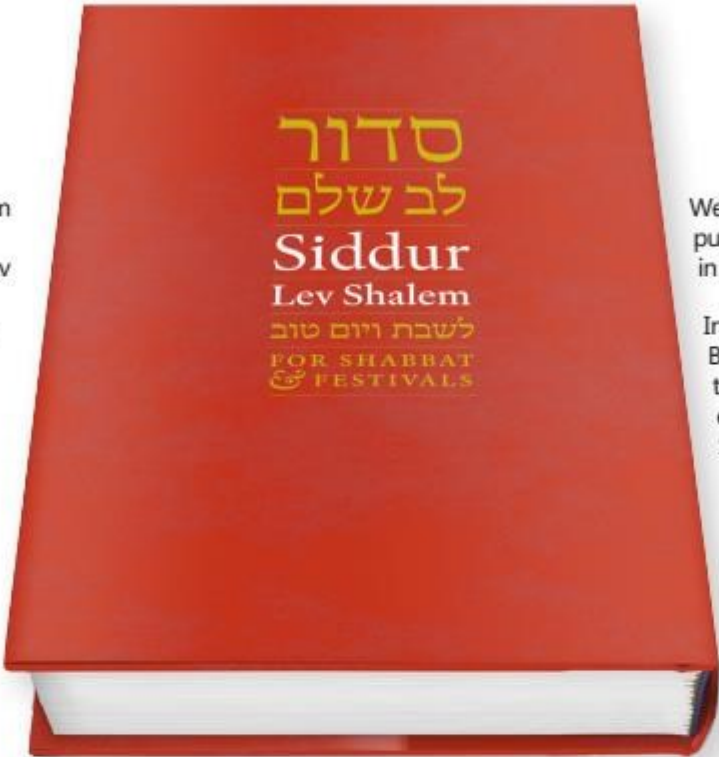

The year 2015 begins with some important and exciting happenings at Temple.

- **Scott Franklin** has been elected by the Board of Trustees to complete the term year for VP, Finance. Scott brings a fresh perspective to our Temple finances, as well as experience administering financial operations. We are excited to have Scott as a member of the Executive Board and Trustees.
- **Judy Levy**, who was elected to a new term on the Board has stepped down, with her position filled by Scott. Thank you to Judy for her past and ongoing commitment to Temple. She will continue to manage our kitchen operations and participate actively as a volunteer.
- We have recently received two gifts from the Farash Foundation, one to apply to general operations and one focused on educational scholarship. As we look toward future facility needs and in consideration of our balanced budget, we will save the general operating funds for future facility needs. We are very appreciative of these donations and are studying how the educational funds can be used to support the congregation's children and their education.
