I believe that we are about meaningful prayer, engaged learning, and community. These heart-felt beliefs permeate every service, every event, and every learning experience at Temple Beth David. And they did not originate with any one person. They emerged from the hands that built our Temple building, the people who took out second mortgages on their homes so they could have a synagogue, the time and energy of so many volunteers, and the voices of the parents and children who come to our services and learn in our Religious School.

Meaningful Prayer: Our Temple Beth David community is a house of prayer and a nurturing place that encourages *mitzvot* to flourish. Temple Beth David is the place where we address the spiritual strivings of our members every Shabbat. Although we preserve the traditions of our past, we also seek a higher purpose and meaning in life

through the meditations of our minds, the prayers of our hearts, and the work of our hands.

Engaged Learning: Although we did not name ourselves the "People of the Book" (this term was coined by Islam, and adopted by medieval Jews), we all study and express our own "Torah" -context, "Torah" means all of Jewish learning, not just the Chumash (the Five Books of Moses). Study of and familiarity with our sacred tradition is the starting point for an engaged Jewish identity. Whether we learn through our chavurot, animated discussions at shul, or attending classes, it is incumbent upon all of us to make the traditions of our people come alive with a pressing relevance. Torah, while it is our unique, sacred inheritance, bears a message for all of humanity. Thus, our tradition of living torah informs both our particular identity and our shared humanity.

Community: Community includes our Temple Beth David members, the modern state of Israel and the entire people of Israel. A contemporary Jewish identity that does not serve its members' spiritual needs, relate to the State of Israel, and include world Jewry is somehow incomplete. To be Jewish means to understand our personal destiny as part of the historical Jewish narrative and the world-wide circle of concern.

Hanukkah Celebrated Worldwide by Servicemen

This year's Soldiers Hanukkah Project was a tremendous success. Jewish soldiers serving our country in Afghanistan, Iraq and around the world celebrated the holiday with the help of cards and care packages from Jewish Community in Rochester. For the third year, Temple Beth David has coordinated the project which collected Hanukkah cards, decorations, baked goods and other items.

Over 500 handmade cards were created by students at the Temple Beth David, B'rith Kodesh, Sinai, Beth El schools; Derech Ha Torah, Etz Chaim and Hillel Community Day Schools and the Ora Academy. In addition, Temple Beth David members and the families of the students of the other schools baked cookies and cakes for the care packages.

In total 35 Hanukkah care packages were sent to Rabbi/ Chaplains and lay leaders serving Jewish service members as well as individual soldiers located in remote bases. Each package contained: Hanukkah baked goods, dreidles, chocolate gelt, decorations (including cups, plates and napkins), challah, grape juice and dozens of the children's cards. Menorahs and candles were sent to soldiers that requested them. Along with the care packages, more than a hundred Jewish soldiers received Hanukkah cards made by the children from Rochester.

The Hanukkah project is the latest in a year-round effort by Temple Beth David to serve Jewish soldiers both overseas and in the U.S. In 2010, Temple Beth David has sent care packages for Purim, Pesach and Rosh Hashanah.
