
have active roles on the bimah Please, please keep in mind the following:

**Income**: Income is UNDER budget mainly because of shortfalls in dues on account of the long term down trend in Synagogue membership. Major ability to pay full dues. fundraising events have been strong, with Bingo leading the way. Contribution to the David Solomon fund (building operations) has also been very strong, especially thanks to some recent contributions in response to the appeal.

Looking forward to next year's budget, we have projected a lower income, more in line with budget by 77%. We originally this year's results. We will be invoking a 3% increase in dues and this will be reflected in your January bill for the first half on 2014. I hope you will agree that being included in our budgeting this is necessary and that you

can afford the increase. As always, contact the office or myself to discuss individual circumstances that effect your

Right now, the best thing YOU can do for income is to encourage some non-affiliated and hopefully sign up as full dues paying members. 5 to 10 new families would completely erase the deficit.

**Expenses**: Expense is UNDER budgeted for \$241,600 just like our income, but our bookkeeper, Lisa Worden, found some expense categories that were not and Bingo). process, so that has been added

to our record keeping and changed our budget for this vear. But by far the biggest factor impacting this year's expense was the necessity to have two Rabbis for part of 2013. That will not be the case in 2014, so we have been able to project reduced expenses for families to come to shul, meet us next year and hopefully a return to a balanced budget.

> Bottom line is we continue to run a very fiscally lean operation and our dues are the best bargain in town for affiliated families. We expect to be in the black next year with some upside potential (additional members







#### **SOUP-ER SHABBAT RECIPES** by Bill Sheuermann



Hello all!

Because so many people have asked for my soup recipes, I have decided to try and translate them for you. I will feature one or two soups per bulletin. I do not follow "word for word" any specific recipe. I use recipes as guidelines and ideas for things I enjoy. The recipes I will be submitting are my ideas of what I think will taste good. PLEASE feel free to add or subtract your own favorite ingredients and spices. My goal is to try and be creative. There are only a couple of tools you will need: an immersion or regular blender and an open mind.

Without further ado... B'tayavon. -Bill

2 1/4 lbs butternut squash (halved/seeded) 1 1/2 tsp butter 1 medium onion 1 leek sliced 2 cloves garlic sliced 1 1/2 cans of (49.5 fluid oz) veg broth 2 large russet potatoes guartered 1 Granny Smith apple cored and split into 1/8's dash of cayenne pepper dash of ground allspice dash of ground nutmeg dash of ground ginger salt and pepper to taste 1/3 cup sherry wine 1/4 cup sour cream (optional) 3/4 cup 1/2 & 1/2 cream

Preheat oven to 375. Pour a thin layer of water into a baking dish or sided cookie sheet and place squash halves, cut side down on dish. Bake for 45 mins or until can be easily pierced with fork. Cool slightly then peel. Set aside.

Melt the butter in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onion, leek, and garlic and saute until tender. Pour in broth, add potatoes, bring to boil and cook for about 20mins. Add the squash and apple mashing into smaller bits. Using blender, puree until smooth then return to pot.

Add cavenne, all spice, nutmeg, ginger, salt and pepper, then stir in sherry and  $1/2 \otimes 1/2$ . Heat through but do not boil. Dollop with sour cream (optional)


