Martians, Grasshoppers, and Stars

A Jewish astronaut just returned from Mars and was asked all about his journey. He mentioned that while he was there, among other things, he was actually invited to a Martian Bar Mitzvah.

An intrigued reporter jumped right in: "Please, tell us all about it. Was it nice? Was it fun? How was the food?"

The astronaut replied that it was just "OK."

"What do you mean?" snapped the newsman. "Was it the food?"

"No", said the astronaut, "the food was fine."

"Were the people not nice?" countered the reporter.

"No, the people were very friendly."

"Well, then, what was it?" asked the reporter. "Why was the Martian Bar Mitzvah only OK?"

The astronaut looked at him and replied ... "There was no atmosphere."

In order to breathe -- in order to live as human beings, whether on Earth, on Mars or in the Middle East, -- we need to create an atmosphere that works for on many levels -- an atmosphere where people can develop -- culturally,

religiously, and personally, -- grow in confidence, in humanity, and in compassion.

In parashat Shelach Lechah, which we read last month, Moses sends twelve tribal leaders to Cana'an "to see what kind of country it is." It is a time of stress and anxiety for these community leaders. They fear impending war and bloodshed. The Torah tells us that the tribal leaders who return from their reconnaissance mission come back with radically different versions of what they saw. Ten of the leaders say, "We came to the land to which you sent us; it does indeed flow with milk and honey. However, the people who live in the land are powerful, the cities are well fortified...the land devours its inhabitants...all the people that we saw in it are men of great size - and we looked like grasshoppers to ourselves, and so we must have looked to them." Splintering from his compatriots, Caleb asserts a radically different perspective, "We will go up, -- go up into this land and we will inherit it...." Then Caleb and Joshua, together, tell the people, have no fear of the people of the country...[h]ave no fear of them."

Caleb and Joshua do not debate or deny the facts of what the other leaders said, rather, they urge that regardless of the apparent *hopelessness* of their situation, the people must *still* July Schedule



What's next for Temple Beth David? We have installed an energetic and enthusiastic new rabbi and survived some unexpected challenges. Our membership is mostly stable, but the trend is downward. We have a knowledgeable core at topic of strategic direction. There are Shabbat services, but attendance is not growing. We will have our own Hebrew School, but classes are very small -especially in the younger grades. We have a lovely facility, but there are significant maintenance projects that will need to be financed. I think there may be a growing sense that it will be difficult away? Is it possible to change that perto remain a viable, stand-alone, fullservice, Conservative Temple in Irondequoit over the next 10 years. But which aspect do we change -- viable? standalone? full-service? Conservative? Irondequoit?

For a number of years we have flirted with the idea of moving, and some quality work has been done in committees, but we have not yet found a way to have a true community conversation on the many questions that need exploring. Among them: What community needs are we currently meeting? What unmet needs exist within our congregation? What unmet needs exist within the Rochester Jewish Community? Why is Irondequoit perceived as being so far ception? Can we afford a move? How can we continue to serve our members in Irondequoit if we move to another location? Should we consider some kind of a consortium with other local institutions? Which ones? What aspects of our

current identity should be maintained? What should be changed?

I think it is important that we all consider not only: 'How is Temple Beth David going to thrive in the years to come?' But also: 'Why is it important that we survive?' I am not sure how to have this important community conversation, but I know that all of us should be considering these questions and discussing them with our friends and families. We are a diverse group so initial answers are likely to vary greatly, but I am confident that we can work together for a bright future. I look forward to hearing your thoughts.

ascend into the land and have faith
that God will be with them. As Rashi
explains Caleb's statement, "Even if
we were commanded to ascend to the
heavens, we would be obligated to get
a ladder and begin climbing."

Like Rabbi Mike Greenspan and many of you, I am overwhelmed and confused by the conflicting versions of what happened in June in the Middle East. I've read the editorials, some condemning and others defending Israel. I've watched the videos of Israeli soldiers rappelling onto the Flotilla and peace activists attacking them with iron bars and make-shift weapons.

What is the "truth?" I don't know. Like every one of us, I have my predispositions to believe one version of the story or another. My tendency is to believe all of the facts or the truths of this incident, and make up my own mind. However, the "truth" is often the first victim in times of crisis -- such as is reported in our parashah - and such as the incident that occurred on the Mavi Marmara.

For me the truth is this: both sides - Israel, fearing for its continued *existence*, and the Palestinians, seeking to *establish* theirs, "are as grasshoppers in their own eyes." And as perceived victims and grasshoppers, both sides have often found it difficult to see their

world as it is rather than as they see themselves. Our brothers and sisters in Israel and in Gaza are not grasshoppers, nor are they giants. They are human beings.

If we were to create a space in which to nurture human beings who believe they are grasshoppers, what would our atmosphere be like? Before answering this question, it might be helpful for us to consider the possibility that we are all grasshoppers in our own eyes in one way or another. Izzv may be a rocket scientist, but unless he has been genetically engineered, he probably isn't a basketball star, and in this way he may see himself as a small and ineffective grasshopper-like person. Who of us isn't really bad at something? Who of us doesn't want to be accepted for who we are? So, perhaps our first step is recognizing that we need to cross the doormat of victimhood, and our doormat announces: "All grasshoppers are welcome. Perfect people need not apply."

Once we have established the common ground that we all possess perfect human flaws, we have created the foundation of an environment where we can *work* on ourselves -- together. We can make a safe space where any one of us can stand up and say: "Hello, my name is Aviva Berg and I am a grasshopper. I haven't been scared for 40 days." I used to be insecure and over-react to real or per-

ceived insults. I used to take offense, when no offense was intended. I used to over-compensate for my sense of inferiority, and I fell into the trap of perfectionism to avoid criticism."

Our Tradition tells us to write two notes and keep one in each pocket. One note says, "I am nothing but dust and ashes." The other note says, "For me the world was created." We are instructed to look at the first note - "I am nothing but dust and ashes" - if we lose our temper or act inappropriately -- and to look at the second note - "For me the world was created" - when we feel hurt or wounded. Over time, we become less angry and feel less wounded. And then, perhaps, we come to realize that the two notes together teach us something further every atom in our bodies is dust -stardust -- of which the world is created. We are all connected universally. And we're all stars – Martians, Israelis, Palestinians, grasshoppers, Americans, and all manner of human beings - sharing the same atmosphere, sharing the same vulnerabilities, and sharing the same dreams. May we all be blessed to see the world as it can be, and make it so


