From the Rabbi's Desk

During the years 1933—1939, during which German Jewry suffered painfully under the ever-increasing oppression of the Nazi regime, something rather remarkable took place in the German-Jewish community. Despite the dwindling of its population and its resources, German Jewry underwent a religious and cultural revival. Increasingly excluded from society, its economic base weakening by the day, German Jews nevertheless bonded together for mutual support and for providing needed social and welfare services. They engaged in Jewish learning and the serious study of Jewish texts, participated in adult education programs, learnt Hebrew, attended lectures and concerts performed by Jewish musicians. Perhaps most remarkable of all, after years of religious apathy, thousands of German Jews flocked to the synagogue where, on Shabbat and holy days, they found spiritual sustenance, the support that comes from community solidarity, and the motivation to reach into their own inner resources to face the harsh and cruel world around them. This short-lived social, cultural and religious renaissance is only now being fully appreciated by historians.

While our current economic recession pales into insignificance compared to the fate of German Jewry during those harrowing years of 1933—1939 and the abyss that followed afterwards, the experience of those years surely has something to teach and inspire us. Members of Temple Beth David are not unaffected by the present economic downturn. There are members who have lost their jobs and others are who are living in fear and uncertainty as to whether they will be able to hold onto theirs. Many seniors have seen their savings and investments tumble precipitously and they naturally worry about the future. Others have to think twice about the cost of the gas before riding to TBD. More specifically, we have members worrying about their membership dues and some have even considered discontinuing their membership. But if there is anything that I have learnt about Temple Beth David is that it is a compassionate and understanding community and it will do its utmost to make sure that all will remain part of our community during this difficult and trying time. If you are undergoing difficulties, don't be embarrassed or afraid to share your situation and ask for help.
