Counting on Ourselves...

What is the purpose of a census? What does it mean to us as Jews, as Americans, and as members of Temple Beth David?

In the United States, the Constitution mandates that every ten years we count everybody. Representation at every level of the government is based on population. Up until the current year's census, the decennial census has traditionally been done by a door to door head count. In 2000, the government hired 950,000 professionals and spent \$6.9 billion. The energy, effort, and cost of taking a census are staggering.

However, the problem with our census is that head counts are also staggeringly inaccurate. There is no way to count the homeless. There is a large and growing proportion of people who don't speak English. And many people living in inner cities don't want to open their doors and answer questions. Statisticians have proven that population sampling is a much better way of taking a good census. However, the legal argument against using sampling data for purposes of taking the census is that this method is unconstitutional. Nevertheless, this hasn't stopped Congress from repeatedly trying to pass a law permitting sampling on the basis that Article I, Section 2 of the Constitution of the United States of America is archaic.

It originally read: "Representatives and direct taxes shall be apportioned among the several states which may be included within this Union, according to their respective numbers, which shall be determined by adding the whole number of [free] persons [and 3/5ths of all other persons,] including those bound to service for a term of years."

We know now, that in the 2000 census, 9 million people, mostly African Americans, weren't counted. And in the same census 4 million people, mostly white, were counted twice. Sampling will give a much better count that bears a relationship to reality and in the long run will cost \$4 billion less and be more reliable than a door to door head count. Every single commission, including the Census Bureau itself has said, "sampling is better."

So, a door to door head count in this country means that the census will not count the people who need to be counted the most. In important political, social, and economic ways, they become invisible. Neither their personal needs nor their respective responsibilities are recognized. And they aren't fully represented in Congress.

But, honestly, whether we do statistical sampling or door-to-door head count-

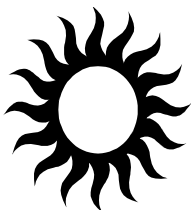

ing, both methods can be contrasted to the Torah's personal and ceremonial approach that includes all of the people in the wilderness community. The thirteenth century Spanish sage, Rabbi Moses ben Nachman (*Nachmanides*), observes that Moshe conducts the census in a special manner. Instead of just numbering the people, those taking the poll are instructed by Moshe "to do so in a manner that will give honor and importance to each person." According to *Nachmanides*, Moshe tells the poll takers, "Do not ask the head of each family for the number of people in the family. Rather, invite each person to pass before me. Take down that person's name, and let each one feel honored to be part of the census." By seeing each person individually, Moshe encourages pride and feelings of self-worth. Expanding upon this idea, *Nehama Leibowitz* emphasizes that the Biblical census impressed "on us the value and critical worth of each and every soul, which is a unique creation of God and a world of its own."

The nineteenth century German commentator, Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsh, a pulpit rabbi, points out that the real significance of the census is, as

indicated on Exodus 30:12, paying a half-shekel toward supporting the community. For Rabbi Hirsh, "a Jew is counted upon by the community for support and is only a part of the census when doing something to benefit the entire community. Rabbi Hirsh's sentiment is expressed by the prayer for our congregation every Shabbat, in which a special reader asks God to bless all of you, including your sons, and daughters, and their families who united to build our synagogue, who keep it going by giving funds for heat and light, ... who read Torah, chant haftorah, and sponsor Kiddush. And not only that, but those of you who are unsung heroes and who devote your time and energies to bake, teach, and volunteer in whatever way is needed.

Rabbi Hirsch sees even more than a lesson of community responsibility and generosity in the ancient Israelite census. He sees what we have here at Temple Beth David – a valuable model of community organization. "The individuals first group themselves into families, and families into tribes, and finally the tribes into one common 'house of Israel.'" Then as now, all are linked "by a common inner factor, and each one of them must feel itself to be ... a concrete and important part of this unity." For Rabbi Hirsch, the census

enabled every member of the family to be counted by name, "so that each one joins the whole, conscious of the importance of his personality to the people."

Our sages have tended to view the census as a model of community responsibility, not only for the people of Israel, but for all humanity.

"Essentially, it underscores not only the importance of preserving and promoting individual rights and creativity, but also strengthens the bonds of family, diverse religious, social, political, and economic associations as a means of ensuring a secure human future."

We are counted because each and every one of us counts. We are no longer voiceless slaves, anonymous statistics, or faceless, homeless composites. Especially in our increasingly technology-driven times, because we have created a community, -- we are more than the sum of our *L'Chaims* and cholent -- we have forged individual and collective existential identities within a common design and purpose.

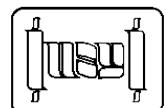

News from IHSC

The IHSC met only 3 times in April because of the Passover and April breaks, so I thought I would take you behind the scenes a little bit. The principals of the Hebrew schools have been meeting monthly all year to plan community-wide programs. This year I have been the chair of the group—the position rotates amongst the principals.
