Why Do We Study on Erev Shavuot?

The practice of staying up all or part of the night to study Jewish texts during the evening of the first day of Shavuot (the *Tikkun Leil Shavuot*) began among the *kabbalists* in Safed in the 16th century. These learned Jewish mystics considered study an act of atonement. Originally, on Shavuot they studied Jewish sources in a particular order, and the entire night took on additional significance. According to Rabbi Alberto Arbiv of the Iyun Academy in Tel Aviv, Shavuot, as the time of the giving of the Torah, is also seen [by the *kabbalists*] as a mythological wedding between the Holy One and the people of Israel. On the night before the *chuppah* (the Jewish wedding ceremony), the bride is adorned with Torah study. "Tikkun," in this sense, means adornment, and when a person studies Torah into the night, it is as though that individual is creating pearls from the verses, and making them into necklaces – which become the ornaments of the bride. In this way, we become beautiful, worthy partners of God.

The focus of all night study used to be the Tanakh, (The Torah, the Prophets, and the canonical Writings), the Talmud, and *halakhah* (Jewish religious law), but nowadays the interest - in both religious and

secular society - is more in *midrash* (creative interpretations of sacred texts), *aggadah* (homiletics and non-legal writings), Jewish philosophy, mysticism, Hasidism. modern poetry, literature, comparative religion, and art. This creates a range for learning that is more comprehensive and rich. We are witnessing the phenomenon of secular and non-Jewish people taking an interest in traditional Jewish sources, as well as creating and learning from new forms of Jewish expression.

There is a cultural flowering in Israel surrounding Shavuot. What are they planning on learning this year? According to Ha'aretz, at the Shalom Hartman Institute, there will be academic lectures on "What the Rambam Can Teach a Perplexed Jew," and "Belonging and the Policy of Acceptance into the Jewish Community." At Hadassah's Merkaz Hamagshimim, they are promising "Pluralistic study under the open sky." At Beit Midrash Elul. Israelis will speak on poetry as *midrash* (exposition and commentary) in the Book of Ruth, the Ba'al Shem Tov and his ideas, and A.D. Gordon - Man and Nature.

March 21 was an "out of the box" day. Parents joined their children to learn together about the parts of the Pass-over seder and their deeper meanings. Families divided into "tribes" that travelled together from activity to activity following the order of the seder. Kids worked together to create an "order of the seder" poster. People raced to create salt water and dip parsley into it. People worked together to retell the story of the exodus. Parents and children debated why G-d chose the 10 plagues as the method for freeing the Israelites, and then they assembled plague bags to use as props at the seder. Families participated in a game of identifying the 4 children. Children

and parents collaborated to make new matzah covers and to create their own charoset. And, children searched the building for the "afiko-man" while their parents learned a piece of what the Talmud has to say about the afiko-man. The morning concluded in TBD's main sanctuary with a little bit of Hallel, a chance to hear the tribes' cheers, and a play performed by the Hineni teens. 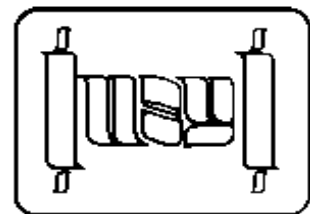

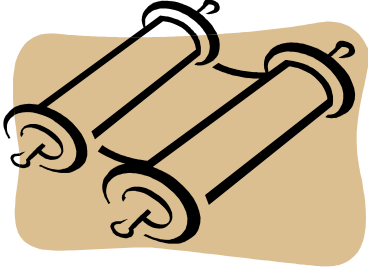
