## *Coming Face to Face With Who We Are*

### *Kol Nidre Sermon*

Mrs. Cohen went to visit her son, Howard, who lived with a female roommate named Rebecca. At dinner, Mrs. Cohen couldn't help but notice how attractive Howard's roommate was and she started to wonder if there was more going on between Howard and his Rebecca than he had told her. Reading his Mom's thoughts, Howard volunteered, 'Mom, I know what you must be thinking, but I assure you, Rebecca and I are just roommates.'

A week later, Rebecca came to Howard saying, 'Ever since your mother came to dinner, I've been unable to find the ceramic salt shaker. Do you think your Mom might have taken it?' Howard replied, 'I doubt it, but I'll email her and ask.'

'Dear Mom, I'm not saying that you 'did' take the salt shaker, I'm not saying that you 'did not' take it, but the fact remains that it has been missing ever since you were here for dinner. Love, Howard.' Several days later he received a reply: 'Dear Howard, I'm not saying that you 'do' sleep with Rebecca, and I'm not saying that you 'do not' sleep with her. But the fact remains that if she was sleeping in her own bed, she would have found the salt shaker by now' - Love, Mom.

Never -- ever -- underestimate the love and wisdom of a parent. They often know more than we will ever understand. It can be painful when our parents or our children challenge us. But, if it is done with love and compassion, it strikes a chord that we may be able to hear. This twinge that

we feel when we go from denial to awareness can be uncomfortable. And this discomfort is exactly what we need to hold on to for the next 25 hours.

Yom Kippur is a gift, a moment set aside for this process of becoming aware of our shortcomings and our fears, for apologizing for the hurtful words we spoke and actions we took under their influence. And most importantly, Yom Kippur is a moment for accepting both human and Divine forgiveness and for letting our guilt and shame go. -

Tonight, we bring ourselves closer to God, just as God is closer to us. Tonight, let us not only accept God's forgiveness for all the vows we didn't keep, let us also invoke God's help in strengthening ourselves in our commitments. The mark of meaningful change is to be in the same position that we were in when our actions fell short and then, to not repeat our behavior. Let us ask God this evening for the strength, to help us keep the commitments and promises we make this year. Let us compose ourselves and take a deep breath.

"Dear God - All vows, promises, and commitments made in Your Presence since last Yom Kippur and in the years before, may we be given the strength to keep them:

Our marriage and commitment vows - may they endure

I hope that everyone has had a chance to look at our new Temple Beth David web site. If not, I suggest you go right to [www.tbdrochester.org](http://www.tbdrochester.org) and check it out.

As with our old web site, we are hosted at no charge by United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism (USCJ.) The old site required a significant amount of computer skills and attention to detail, and we owe a lot of gratitude to Mike Berke for his years of diligence in building and maintaining that site.

The new site takes advantage of a software package called Wordpress which is well-known across the Internet as the basis for millions of blogs. This technology will allow us to share the responsibility of regular updates among a larger group of people. Website visitors will also be

able to leave comments on articles or other posts, so it is possible for on-line discussions to develop.

In addition to the new design, you may notice that the site features Rabbi Bergs sermons, and Torah and Haftorah summaries. Of course, reading this information on-line is no substitute for the live experience of Shabbat services! The web version does make it possible to read for something you may have missed at services, allows for those who were unable to attend services to read the commentaries, and lets prospective members learn more about our Shabbat services and Rabbi.

The site also has a Temple Events Calendar. Please take advantage of this convenient source of information, and please help us keep it current by letting us know promptly about any

new events or changes.

There are many other little things on the site that you will want to discover, including a link to our Temple Facebook page. The site is by no means complete. For example, the Religious School section has the school calendar and registration materials, and we hope to add much more including an on-line version of the prayer CD that students use for learning.

And the ways in which we address the  
pain of our daily challenges.

The promises we made to study and to

We meant them when we made them,  
But so many things get in the way.

This time, may we be strong enough to  
let our better selves prevail.

Promises made by the boys and girls  
who have come up on this bimah,

Who glimpsed what life as Jews might  
offer them,

May their dreams and idealism be with  
them throughout their lives.

Commitments made to our family, our  
friends, and our ideals,

God, we meant in all seriousness the

important questions we would like to  
ask You. We mean no disrespect.  
Tonight is a night of honesty. And we  
not only want to become better people,  
we want to become stronger, better-  
educated Jews. We know that you  
endowed us with intelligence and  
reason, in part, so that we question  
be'shem shamayim, in the name of  
Heaven. We think this is the right time  
and place because this is the night  
when we are closest to You. Here are  
our questions:

1. Can we doubt Your existence and  
still be good Jews?
2. Why are there so many rules? Why

do we need organized religion or  
Jewish laws at all? Why isn't it enough  
to just be a good person? (That was  
one question).

3. If Judaism is supposed to make  
people better, how do You account for  
unethical "observant" Jews and for the  
ethical people who do not follow any  
religion or who aren't Jews?

4. How come so many Jews are  
Buddhists?

5. There was a disturbing article  
published in Time Magazine last week.  
We know you heard about it. Is there a  
difference between Anti-Zionism or Anti-  
Israelism and Anti-Semitism?

6. What do we do about intermarriage in  
America? Is it a problem or a sign of  
acceptance and openness? and finally,

7. What is our purpose, as Jews, in the  
modern world?"

Because we invoke the language of  
courts and laws tonight, we hereby  
declare: The Temple Beth David  
community in Rochester, New York  
respectfully submits these questions for  
your consideration. We pray that you  
point us in the right direction and guide  
our conversations and discussions as  
we search for our answers in this new  
year.

It's been a busy summer and early fall in the Temple office. Kudos to Maria Dewhirst, our office manager, and the many volunteers who have helped with projects large and small. Here are some of the administrative highlights of the past few months:

- Maria has taken on additional responsibilities with the creation of the Temple Beth David Religious School. During the summer, she worked many hours with many people in developing a school budget within our accounting software. Throughout the year, she will assist in monitoring the budget and has taken on the payroll duties for the school.

- We developed a new two-page document to be signed by all employees of Temple Beth David. It was developed to ensure that our synagogue is a warm, welcoming and safe place

for congregants young and old. The document addresses *lashon hara/motzi shem ra* and many types of congregant interactions. Rabbi Berg, members of the Executive Board and Board of Trustees, and community advisors have helped us develop this document, ensuring guidelines for appropriate response should they ever be needed in the future. Much of the language comes from documents provided by the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism. Rather than provide a complete reprint of this document here, you can contact the temple office if you would like to see a copy.

- We have expanded our use of volunteers in the office, to help with some of the tasks normally performed by Maria (as she has taken on additional responsibilities related to the school). Thanks to all who have of-

fered to help. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact the office.

- We have begun use of our new logo, developed by Bruce Kielar, on all of our printed materials -- from envelopes to letters to The Bulletin to our website and facebook page! Thanks to Bruce for his creativity and insights.

One additional change in office hours is taking place on Sunday mornings. Maria will work two Sundays a month, full days. On the other Sundays volunteers will be at the office when religious school is in session to answer the phone and greet visitors. The Sundays that Maria will be working will be listed in each month's Bulletin. Please be sure that this is not a reduction in Maria's hours!!! Her church has changed its worship schedule and this adjustment to her work hours will allow Maria to worship with her family.

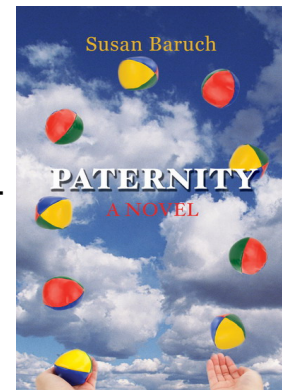

For the third year, Temple Beth David will be sending Hanukkah Care Packages and cards to Jewish soldiers serving overseas. This project comes on the heels of our successful Rosh Hashanah Soldiers Project in which TBD sent 40 care packages to soldiers in Afghanistan, Iraq, Kuwait, Germany, Israel and bases in the US. In addition, about 50 cards made by local Jewish schoolchildren were sent overseas.

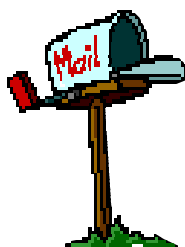
