#### Machzor Lev Shalem Praying with a Full Heart

My father passed away on May 27th. He was a sweet, kind, generous man. In the wake of his death, I have found comfort and truth in the words of Menachem Mendel of Kotzk, "There is nothing so whole as a broken heart." I believe that the Kotzker Rebbe teaches us that, at times, it is through the experience of brokenness that we discover our potential to be increasingly spiritually open, sensitive, and alive to the blessings in our lives.

There is no greater blessing in Arthur's and my lives right now than your words of comfort, support, and acts of kindness. Words cannot convey our gratitude and thankfulness to all of you for your understanding and care. It is of immeasurable help in returning to day-to-day life.

Perhaps it is not a coincidence that on May 22nd, our Temple Beth David Ritual Committee unanimously voted for our community to adopt Machzor Lev Shalem for our upcoming High Holiday Services. Together with our familiar Yamim Noraim melodies, our new Machzor will enhance our High Holiday Services by blending prayer with study -and adding historical context to our prayers, kavanot (meditations), and spiritual meaning. Especially important are the running commentaries that explain each prayer and the transliterations that will make our prayers more accessible to everyone. Even holding the elegant Machzor in our hands will enhance our Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur experience.

The way in which we will bring this beautiful, spiritual resource into our community is through the thoughtful donations of those who wish to honor and memorialize the lives of friends and loved ones who no longer walk this earth. My own Machzor will honor the memory of my father. Without solicitation, others have already stepped forward, committing to the purchase of two hundred (of four hundred) copies of Machzor Lev Shalem -- both for their personal, home libraries and for Temple Beth David's High Holy Day Services.

In order for us to complete the transition of our entire community to Machzor Lev Shalem, I invite and encourage all who can, to purchase this extraordinary prayerbook for your individual and our community's use. Kelly Beller let an engaging discussion on how we can talk with our children and our parents about issues where it is difficult to understand each other's point of view. Our conversations touched upon many sensitive issues. How do we talk about feeling excluded from the lives of our children when we might not be on Facebook or other social media networks? What does it mean to our parents or our own sense of identity and self esteem when we lost our ability to drive safely? How can our social and religious networks create communities that address our changing needs?

**Sy Zivan** provided a learning sheet that focused our attention on identifying "the stranger" in today's world. Who are the people we intentionally or unintentionally exclude? Who carries social, racial or "other" vulnerabilities that, as Jews, we are to protect? Our conversations went down interesting paths -- from U.S. immigration policy, and racial profiling, to marriage rights issues in the Gay-Lesbian-BisexualTransgendered community.
