#### "They Shall Bear Fruit, Even in Old Age"

I just read the most inspirational article about Ms. Bel Kaufman, the new professor of "The History of Jewish Humor" at Hunter College in Manhattan. A natural comedienne, she introduces her class with a joke:

The Frenchman says: "I'm tired and thirsty. I must have a glass of wine." The German says: "I'm tired and thirsty. I must have a beer." The Jew says: "I'm tired and thirsty. I must have diabetes."

Teaching the new course, Ms. Kaufman not only tells Jewish jokes; she analyzes them. "We were investigating why so many comedians are Jewish and so many Jewish jokes are so self-accusing," she explains. "It goes back to immigration from the shtetl, from that poverty, and because the Jew was the object of so much opprobrium and hatred," she said. "The jokes were a defense mechanism: [As if to say:] 'We're going to talk about ourselves in a more damaging way than you could.' "

The teacher of this class, author of the best-selling novel, Up the Down Staircase, and granddaughter of

When asked how it felt starting a new job at age 100, Ms. Kaufman was unfazed: "It must have happened gradually, while I wasn't looking," ... "I feel no different than I felt at 99, 98 or 97." When asked about her second husband, who is ninety-four years old, Ms. Kaufman shrugs: "He likes older women."

In the hands of this mature new teacher, who happens to be Sholem Aleichem's granddaughter, the history of Jewish humor never had it so good.

May we all be blessed to learn, to laugh, and to love.

# **News from the President**

At work I am responsible for leading a team of analysts, programmers, and actuaries. Our job is to provide the rating department with the tools they need to set rates. Recently I was asked to share some of the keys to our ongoing success. On reflection, I believe that while the content could hardly be more different, many of the same principles apply at TBD as well and may point the way for possible improvement.

The first item on the list was: "a high level of cross-training and role flexibility on the team." We don't do a lot of training for our leadership roles at TBD, so this is an area for possible improvement. Every month has been a learning experience in my role as President, and with more than ¾ of my term complete, I still feel like a beginner. I hope to share some of what I have learned with my successor, and I encourage current and past executive

board members to consider when they will serve another term -- perhaps in a different leadership role. I think additional experience and continuity in our leadership will make us wiser and stronger.

The second item was: "investment of a significant amount of time in team meetings sharing problems and options for solutions." Time spent in meetings is one of the big challenges for synagogue leadership. I think we have all been frustrated by meeting time that has felt unproductive, and there is constant pressure to get things done. But sometimes we carry the desire for efficiency too far. New ideas and creative problem solving takes time, and we need to spend time listening to each other so that relationships can develop and so that we can truly learn from everyone's perspective.

The third item: "a flexible approach to release dates allowing time for quality." This item recognizes the importance of achieving a balance between speed and quality on projects. It also applies to our work at Temple where the need for deliberation can often cause frustration for people who are accustomed to making and implementing decisions far more quickly than Temple is able to do so. But patience is a virtue, and sometimes the process for coming to a decision is ultimately more important than the decision itself. A decision on our location and/or affiliation with other Temples falls in this category, and I think that as long as we are working on the issues the final decision will come in its own time.

It is a challenge managing a team at work. And in many ways a leadership role at Temple is far more difficult. Fortunately we can face that challenge together.




