Continuing to Blossom in the Summer

The menorah is one of the most enduring symbols of both individual and national Jewish identity. Our Tradition teaches that when the Kohen Gadol (the High Priest) was instructed to light the evolution of humanity and the healand arrange the flames of the first menorah in the desert Mishkan, he was to eventually extinguish humanity and "raise up the lights," ("beha'alotechah et hanerot"). Every Friday night when we light the Shabbat candles, we recite the blessing culminating with "le'hadlik ner shel Shabbat" (to kindle ... Shabbat candle(s)). The difference in the verb the Torah uses for lighting the first menorah and the action word for lighting our Shabbat candles prompts a question. Why was the read Mishlei (Proverbs) 20:27: "The lights of the menorah instead of to kindle them?

One answer our Tradition gives us is that the High Priest was to light each flame and tend it until each fragile light A lit candle can be snuffed out, or it was able to rise up on its own. Seen in this way, the original menorah became a tree of light, with seven branches of knowledge. Rashi, our eleventh century French commentator, tinguished. whose Torah commentary we are learning together this year, points out that the the wicks of the six outer wells of oil were to be arranged so that they all faced the center wick.


