#### From the Rabbi's Desk

became a bar mitzvah:

While studying with Leo Katzman for his Bar Mitzvah, we came across a mysterious verse in his Torah portion, Bereshit, which teaches that even before the sun, moon and stars were created, God created a primordial light. This is the sermon I delivered on the day that Leo

The rabbis tell us of a spiritual, primoridal light that existed before the sun and that God hid it for future use. Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav believed that this light was hidden in the stories of the Torah. Rabbi

Nachman taught that if we delve deeply enough into the meaning of Torah we will reach a place where the hidden light shines forth in a moment of revelation.

Rabbinic legend tells us that before God withdrew the primordial light, he saved a bit of it inside a jewel and gave it to Adam and Eve when he cast them from the Garden of Eden. The light that shone from within it reminded them of all that they had lost. The history of this Jewel, known as the Tzohar, is as mysterious as the primordial light itself! Tzohar, a word which appears only ONCE in the Torah, is the name of the light source which was built into Noah's ark. This sacred jewel, the rabbis say, reached all the way to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph. The Talmud tells us that Abraham wore this glowing stone around his neck and whoever was sick and peered into the stone was healed. Joseph used the Tzohar to divine the dream interpretations and later the stone was placed

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with Joseph in his coffin. Moses recovered the stone and hung it inside the tabernacle of the Ark where it became the first Ner Tamid.

Earlier this week I might have thought that these legends were just dreams or myths, nothing real, only the imaginings of a wandering people who yearned to tie themselves back, all the way back, to creation itself. But two nights ago, I saw several hundred rays of that hidden primordial light. I witnessed the Or HaGanuz.

I attended a community vigil in Brighton. A few hundred community members showed up to show unity, to spread peace, and to uproot racism and bigotry.

Right here in our own community of Brighton/
Pittsford, a group has assembled who call themselves
White Rochester, whose purpose it is to network likeminded whites for the furtherance of the EuropeanWhite races. Their website states that the group
engages in identity creation, consciousness raising,
and demographic and material advancement. As
heretical thinkers in mainstream society, their effort is
to shape society for a more definitive European-White
future.

Just a few weeks ago, members of White Rochester placed rocks wrapped in a flyer on residents' yards and driveways, intending to gain followers and impose fear. What White-Rochester didn't count on was the <u>response</u>. The <u>Community's</u> response to their hate-filled message was swift and fierce. And it was <u>powerful</u>. The organizers of CURB, Community Uprooting Racism and Bigotry, brought us together in a place where I could stand side by side with my

neighbors; Muslim, Christian, Hindu, African American, Asian. It was here, among all my neighbors, that I felt truly at home. But listening to each person as they took the mic, people of various ethnicities, I heard that often they do not feel comfortable in our shared community or even in their own skin. These people, my neighbors, don't know what people in their own community are really thinking when they see a person with darker skin or different clothing. But one thing is for certain, the rallying cry that reverberated and rebounded, that echoed off of the walls of the Twelve Corners Middle School Gymnasium, was that from now on, we will take their community back, take it as our own, back from those who leave rocks and flyers in our yards.

At the very end of the vigil, Pastor Mike Boucher asked all of us to stand side by side all around the gym and to introduce ourselves to someone we didn't know. He then turned off all the lights and asked that one by one each of us turn on our vigil lights. Some people held tiny lights twisted into a Dixie cup. Some used their smart phones and others had flashlights. While an ethereally beautiful song filled the room, one by one, each light went on until at the very end we were a chain of light. But we didn't "light up" the room. It was still extremely dark and quiet but for the singing coming from the speaker. I knew these glowing rays of light were part of the hidden primordial light that had come out of hiding.

As Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav taught, if we delve deeply enough into the meaning of Torah, we will at last reach a place where the hidden light shines forth in a moment of revelation. I know that as a community, we **experienced** a revelation. We won't tolerate hate or bigotry and we won't stand idly by when others do.

So, do you know how to tell if the hidden light of Creation is released into our world? It won't be bright, it won't light up a room, and that's how you know it's the primordial hidden light. It lights up our consciousness.

This powerful chain of light was a symbol of the great Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav's teaching "Let the good in me connect with the good in others, until all the world is transformed through the compelling power of love."




