From the Rabbi Michael Silbert





The more I think about it, the more I find a connection between Pesach and Rosh HaShanah.

Technically speaking, both of these festivals are associated with Jewish New Year. Concerning Pesach, God tells Moses and Aaron in Exodus 12:2, "This month (in which the Israelites will be freed from Egypt) shall mark for you the beginning of the months; it shall be the first of the months of the year for you"; and with regard to what we now know as Rosh HaShanah, God instructs Moses in Leviticus 23:24, "In the seventh month, on the first day of the month, you shall observe complete rest, a sacred occasion commemorated with loud blasts." It is only by about 200 CE that our sages in the Mishnah begin to call this day Rosh HaShanah, describing it as the day on which the world was created, thereby making it the new year for the counting of years. It is also presented as a day of judgment.

The same verse in the Mishnah explains that Pesach – which comes in the spring – is the new year for crops and agriculture.

One of the hallmarks of Rosh HaShanah is that it is an opportunity for Jews to engage in meaningful contemplation and self -reflection. We examine how we've lived our lives in the past year and evaluate what is worth keeping and what we'd really be better off without; those aspects of ourselves and our behavior that don't serve us well and that get in the way not only of our own happiness, but that also taint others' experience of us and limit the good we do in the world.

Well, Pesach really isn't all that different. Rabbi Kerry Olitzky writes that "the desire to get rid of chametz (leaven) develops its own momentum during the weeks and days just prior to Passover." He explains that "chametz of the soul" is the "baggage we carry from broken promises, failed relationships that weigh heavily on us. It is the refuse of daily living, the residual stuff that emerges

from poor decisions, mistakes in judgment and moral failure."

In order to rid ourselves of it, we have to look for the crumbs – "the remnants of past deeds" – and then we have to root them out. We have to search deep inside ourselves and determine which aspects of who we are we're willing to try live without for (at least) the week of Pesach, in order to grow. Not all that different to Rosh HaShanah at all, if you think about it.

This is how we as Jews experience personal liberation and emancipation at Pesach, even today. Our sages taught that the run-up to, as well as Pesach itself, is a period when God shows particular lovingkindness to all of Israel, setting our souls free from our impurity, represented by chametz, if only we are willing to do our part and accept the invitation to work as God's partners.

May this Pesach season be a time of joyous and meaningful liberation for you and all your loved ones.

By counting the names that come in, we will build an estimate of how much wall space we will need—not only enough to display all of those names, but additional space for later requests, plus of course space for new names. Naturally we will keep all other plaques available in storage, so any one can be retrieved for immediate viewing and eventual mounting.

Fear not; this Bulletin isn't your only chance to weigh in. We will send an email with the list of names attached, then a separate paper mailing to members who have not yet responded, and finish with phone calls as needed.

We also encourage anyone to come into the office to look through the plaques in person. If you are interested in taking home the plaque of a relative rather than having it at Temple Beth David, you can let Rebecca know.

Yahrzeit plaques keep our loved ones' memories alive. Installing plaques in our new space will be a wonderful project, as was the recent reframing and installation of the Chagall Needlepoints in our social hall. Thank you again to Helen Kashtan for spearheading that project and to Rabbi Silbert for inviting an art expert to speak about Chagall during the installation ceremony at our last Friday Night Fresh.
