Rochester Response to Massacre in Christchurch, New Zealand

With memories of last November's massacre at Congregation Tree of Life, in Pittsburgh, still fresh in our minds, we were horrified to learn on Friday morning about the murder of 50 Muslim worshippers in their mosques, in Christchurch, New Zealand.

We as Jews know all to well what it is like to be in the crosshairs of white supremacists. Although we were not the victims this time, it nonetheless felt painfully familiar and far too close for comfort. However, precisely *because* we so cherish the freedom to create community and to gather together in prayer, Jews stood tall and gathered in strength at the Islamic Center of Rochester on Sunday morning. We gathered not only to honor our fallen Muslim sisters and brothers, but also in order to say to our neighbors:

"We value community so much that we are willing to protect yours with ours."

As Abraham responded to God's call, we said: "הְנֵנִי – We are here."
