From the Rabbi Michael Silbert

The Torah teaches us that when God gave the Law to the Jewish People at Mount Sinai, all of us were there to receive it (Deuteronomy 29:14). Not only the

Jews who were alive on that day, but the souls of every single Jew who would ever live – including those Jews not yet born as well as those who would someday make the choice to come to Judaism of their own free will – gathered at the foot of the mountain in that moment. And that includes you and me.

Can you imagine what it must have looked like? A moment that moved the soul, that touched the spirit of everyone present, with truly no-one left behind? Sometimes it occurs to me as I stand before you on the *bimah* on the High Holy Days, that I am being given the opportunity to have but a taste of Sinai. It is such a joy for me to look out at the rows of seats which are filled with Temple Beth David members, their children who might be home for these few days and guests who are seeking a spiritual home, or home away from home, on these holiest of days. This sight is one of the greatest privileges of being a rabbi.

I am reminded also of Ellen DeGeneres taking photos of the audience at the 2014 Academy Awards ceremony and beaming the images onto a massive screen behind her on the stage so that the crowd could see themselves from her perspective; the vision of all of you gathered to receive the Torah once again at Temple Beth David, coming together to make community with each other, is so magnificent that I wish I could project it in real time onto a screen behind myself, so that you could see what I see, so that you too could get a small taste of that spiritual image of every Jewish soul standing together at Mt. Sinai.

As we shuttled between two different venues, our services went off without a hitch, and there are so many people to thank for making this possible:

Thank you to Ellen Brandwein, who spent her second High Holy Days with us in the role

of rnchazan (cantor). It is always a joy for us to welcome Ellen and her young entourage (Shoshana, Jonathan and Eliana) home to Rochester, whether as our *chazan* on the Holy Days or when they are just visiting Ron and Jean.
