It is up to each and every one of us as congregants to think about what we need and want and then work to make it happen. If there is something that we need or want, we need to speak up, talk about it, ask questions and then work to make it happen.

Here are some things that people may typically want or need from their affiliation with a synagogue. Think if these are things that you want or need...and if your needs and wants are being met. And if not, have you raised your hand? Have you tried to engage with others to make change? Shabbat services every week; cultural events; kiddush; visits with others; adult education; weekly kaddish; havdalah; Friday night services. So...that is my first message - Temple Beth David is yours.

The second message is this... we have challenges ahead and we want you to know what is going on and we need to share all of the information we have. The challenges continue to include Covid and the question of who will fill our future leadership positions and the fact that our current location is not accessible. Perhaps the biggest challenge of all is finding ways to encourage more participation in order to ensure the continuation of the events and services which we all value so much.

# Cindy Halpern, 46er

I started climbing high peaks in the Adirondack Mountains with Cascade Mountain in 1994. The 46ers is a non-profit organization started in the 1920's. There is an official list of the 46 peaks in the High Peaks region of the Adirondack Mountains over 4,000 feet. Modern science might have changed which peaks are over 4,000 but completing the original list gets you permission to join. Many of the mountains require climbing over mountains that are in between that don't make the list because they are too close to a larger mountain or not enough elevation change between the next one. There were many years that no mountains were climbed. At some point though, I felt deprived if there was a year when I didn't climb a mountain.

I finished my quest this Sunday, August 29 at 9:35 am on top of Basin Mountain. I then went down Basin and up a mountain I had hiked previously, Saddleback, the hard way, up the famous (or infamous) Saddleback Cliffs.

Mussar is an ancient Jewish tradition of spiritual practice. It is not philosophical or mystical but emphasizes the practical aspects of being a better person, a mensch. We study character traits (middot) such as humility, patience, order, truth, and trust. Participants will discuss and keep journals of their experience with each middah (character trait). All are welcome, whether you've just heard of Mussar or you've been practicing for some time. The group will meet every other week, and members will meet in pairs (chevruta partners) on the alternating weeks.

What is Jewish environmentalism? Judaism intersects with environmentalism on many levels. The natural world plays a central role in Jewish law, literature and liturgical practices. Is it any wonder that we have a notable history of environmental thought and activism? This course will introduce participants to the history of Jewish environmentalism and to its practical implications today.
