



From Rabbi Michael Silbert

May 15, On Sunday, people were murdered by an 18-year-old white supremacist while shopping in a Buffalo supermarket, but an hour away from our homes.

The following day, Mayor Malik Evans asked me to deliver a prayer at a vigil later that week. These are the words I shared.

Creator, we ask that You notice that we gather here in pain and sorrow, outraged at the hideous theft of the life that You breathed into our brothers and sisters, who lie slain in Buffalo. Good people home again.

We ask that you shelter their souls in your loving embrace as instead they have come home to You.

begun to feel the agony of loss; we pray that You will help them bind up the wounds to their spirits and their souls so that in time they should be able to find a renewed sense of hope in humanity and a sense of hope in their country.

God, because You know what is in our hearts, we cannot hide from You our fear that this day was coming, but that we just didn't know the exact hour and address. We knew it because hatred is rampant and because massacres like this one in Buffalo occur all too often, over and over again.

Each time that blood is spilled in the streets and the supermarkets and the places of work and the places of worship - especially black churches and

Jewish synagogues - we send our thoughts and prayers. And God, how You must wonder: "Why do My children refuse to change their behavior and their actions and then they turn to Me and pray that the same will never happen again?"

You told the prophet Hosea:

"I desire goodness, not sacrifice: I desire obedience to God, rather than your offerings." [Hos. 6:6]

And to Isaiah You cautioned:

make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your deeds from before my eyes; cease to do evil, learn to do good; Devote yourselves to justice, Aid the wronged; Uphold the rights of the orphan; Defend the cause of the widow." [Isa. 1:15-17]

> When Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel returned home from marching with Dr. King in 1965, he wrote: "For many of us the march from Selma to Montgomery was about protest and prayer. Legs are not lips and walking is not kneeling. And yet our legs uttered songs. Even without words, our march was worship. I felt my legs were praying."

Covid -19 Safety Protocol for inside Temple Beth David

If you are experiencing symptoms - including sore throat, cough, fever, or congestion not due to seasonal allergies - please do not attend temple activities, including services.



Masks (surgical or N95 or KN95) must be worn over the mouth and nose at all times, even when speaking / singing / chanting into the microphone. No other masks are acceptable. Surgical and KN95 masks are provided by Temple Beth David for those who do not have their own. Temple Beth David requires all attendees to be fully vaccinated, including medically recommended booster shots, according to the DC.

If you have tested positive for Covid, or experience symptoms regardless of test results, please wait five days after symptoms have cleared before returning to in-person services and seek guidance from your doctor.
