# From Interim President, Helen Kashtan



Rabbis write about the concept of the Mishkan (portable sanctuary) as a model for the concept of unity in diversity. The Torah details each aspect of this building of the Mishkan, including the many different contributions needed for building it. It

was a project built by the generosity of heart. Individuals were so generous and the building of the Mishkan was successful.

The success of this sacred project teaches us a crucial lesson, whether speaking about the world, our nation, our community, our families, or our shul. Each of us matters, and each of us has something unique to share.

In March 2020, Rabbi Michael Schwab, wrote, "For example, the Mishkan would not have been built if every person gave the same gift or knew the very same craft. So our differences can actually be our strength. Unity in diversity may be difficult, but when it succeeds there is nothing holier or more powerful." I want our shul to succeed amidst all of our differences.

At the time of this writing, I have been interim President for about a month and I have four previous years as President. As in those years, today we continue to face the challenges most faith communities face. Budget, membership, volunteerism. Along with our Board, and in adherence to our bylaws and standard practice for synagogues which are members of the USCJ, I will work to build upon our multitude of strengths and shore up areas that need shoring up. You can be sure that I will be open with communication (you've already received two Volume 69 Issue 8

letters from me!), and I will be available for discussion (not on Shabbat, please).

While I understand you may not agree with every decision our Board and congregation makes, I ask you to consider this question once asked by a synagogue president during a meeting of the Rochester Area Synagogue Presidents' Council: Can you live with it?

Even if something doesn't seem like it's going your way, can you still grow and thrive with the situation? Since I heard that question, I have found that in almost all situations the answer is indeed "Yes. I can live with it."

Why am I writing this? We use information as a commodity when we're engaged in or building relationships and alliances, and sometimes gossip gets woven in. We all know that gossip, about a person or a process, is detrimental to success. As we move forward lets keep the conversation going in positive ways. The word chesed means grace, benevolence, compassion. and loving-kindness. Let those words be the foundation for words and action at Temple Beth David.



### **COVID Prevention Protocols – Updated July 2022**

We will monitor community COVID transmission and modify these protocols as necessary.

#### Masking:

#### Masks remain mandatory in the sanctuary and other synagogue spaces.

Our goal is to keep the sanctuary a safe and welcoming environment for all who attend services.

The continued wearing of masks allows us to ease some of the restrictions we have had within the sanctuary.

#### Kiddush:

Eating outdoors is preferable during warm weather months. Indoor kiddish will be an option. Eating indoors without a mask is not a "*safe space*" and can be done with common sense for social distancing to reduce risk.

- Masks may be removed ONLY when seated at a table.
- Masks are required when not seated, such as walking about, in food service lines or standing in any area.

### **Covid Pre-Services Screening**

- 1. Do you have any of the following symptoms?
  - Fever of 100.4°F or higher, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea
  - If you have any symptoms, do not come to services.
- Have you had any known exposure to someone who tested positive or had presumed COVID in the past 7 days?
  - If yes and asymptomatic, you can take a rapid antigen (home or medical facility) test and attend
    if negative.
  - Test must be taken the day of services prior to your arrival.
- 3. Has anyone in your household tested positive for COVID in the past 10 days?
  - If yes, you can attend only if a rapid antigen test (home or medical facility) is negative on Day 5 or later since your last exposure to that household contact.
  - Test must be taken the day of services prior to your arrival.
