From Philip Katzman, President

Shalom Chaverim! I am your new TBD president starting a 2-year term in January 2023. First, thank you for placing confidence in my ability to fill the shoes of the prior presidents in the recent congregational vote. Second, thanks to other congregants who have

stepped up to perform essential tasks for the congregation, including Toby Berke (VP Administration), David Langmann (VP Finance), Scott Davis (VP Building), Ron Brandwein (VP Ritual), and Bev Zwick (Recording Secretary). Thanks to Andrew Berger, Ed Drexler, and Lisa Klein for accepting new positions on the board, and to returning board members Scott Bauman, Judy Fleissig, Anne Goldin, Cindy Halpern, Sue Lederer, and Karen Schaffer. Thanks to our interim president, Helen Kashtan for keeping us on track over the past 6 months; to Sue Eckhaus for her infectious energy that has carried us through the bulk of the COVID-19 pandemic; and to Lewis Rothberg for his constant support.

You may know me as the guy who reminds you every year to sign up for the golf outing as a cochair for our Annual Joint Golf Outing over the past 8 years. Or the one with the colorful Excel tables at the congregational meeting that describes our financial status as VP Finance over the past 3 years. I also chant haftarah and an occasional Aliyah on Shabbat. You may also know my wife Joanne who has supported my endeavors with TBD, and our sons, Leo (a sophomore at Binghamton University) and Seth (a junior at Brighton High School). Joanne and I joined TBD in 2000. I originate from the Boston area, I am a professor at University of Rochester, and I am a Kohen (similar to a prior president – look at the end to find out who). At the University of Rochester, I am a pediatric pathologist and I work closely with another member of our Conservative community, Leon Metlay (who is also a Kohen!). As I enter the presidency, there are challenges ahead, but opportunities that also await. The Relocation Task Force has been reviewing the alternatives for a new location and Helen Kashtan has related to the congregation that the most likely scenario will be a relocation to TBE as a tenant, similar to our status at TBK. There is potential for (and has been recently) some collaborative programming. Given that the congregation has authorized the Board of Trustees to proceed with negotiations with TBE, I will be working with Helen, the task force, and the board to iron out details of a tenancy there.

The COVID pandemic has affected our congregation over the past 3 years. While our leaders have tried to keep us safe by following the current recommendations to date, there is now recognition that the virus is now endemic and will be with us very much like influenza. Since these viruses (as well as RSV) are currently predominant, I will continue to seek guidance from our medically trained congregants as what has been called the COVID Task Force. Masks will continue to be a tool to use for everyone to be safe, but in the new year we hope to be able to liberalize mask wearing when possible.

According to Martin Buber, the Hasidic rabbi, Yekhiel Mikhal, tells a tale in which one of his disciples asked him how his work can approach the works of his forefathers, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The rabbi answered that "Just as our fathers invented new ways of serving, each a new service according to his own character: one the service of love, the other that of stern justice, the third that of beauty, so each one of us in his own way will devise something new in the light of the teachings and of service, and do what has not yet been done."

May we all find our strengths to support each other in the coming year.
