From the Desk of the Rabbi

So there I was, sitting on the Talmud Torah of Minneapolis bus. My bus driver's name was Sheridan. I think he might have even been Jewish. The Talmud Torah of Minneapolis was a collaboration of all three of the large Conservative synagogues in town. It was a huge building. It had its own fleet of buses marked clearly: The Talmud Torah of Minneapolis.

The bad thing about riding that bus was that you knew everyone was staring at the weird words they had never heard of. I'm 100% certain they were saying: What is Talmud Torah? And I am sure that passers by were getting a good look into those windows to gawk at these weird Talmud Torah of Minneapolis children. The great thing about riding this bus was that I got to be in this bus for who knows how long with kids who were a lot older than me. Kids who were doing the same thing as I was, going to Talmud Torah Monday, Tuesday and Thursday From 5 to 8 PM fall, spring and winter.

And don't think that my weekends were free just because I attended nine hours of Hebrew School during the week. We all went to SMP, Saturday Morning Program at our synagogues as well. Another three hours 9-12. And you know what? I didn't hate it. The fact is, I loved seeing my Jewish friends. I loved this connection I had with a group of people who shared these twelve

hours with me. We didn't exactly know the reasons why our bonds were so close, but there was a sense that somehow we were all in this together. It was something we could never experience with our non-Jewish friends.

There was something special, something that our other friends couldn't understand. Maybe it was the responsibility, the burden of this after school and weekend commitment we all shared. But I think it was more than that.

Experiences can throw people together, but there was this notion instilled within all of us that this "other" life we shared was precious. I don't think anyone vocalized these meaningful ties. Yet there they were, as shiny as the beautiful floors in the foyer that led up to the main sanctuary - as high as the ceiling that cast its shadow on the bimah and on the balcony. And as permanent as the scores of names that lined our synagogue walls.

But, I was talking about Sheridan, my bus driver. The one with the words Talmud Torah of Minneapolis displayed on both sides of the bus. One night, as we were returning home after Hebrew School in Minnesota, after 8 o'clock in the evening it was DARK. Sheridan pulled to a stop, opened the door and after a pause called out to me,

"Rachel, this is your stop". I was sitting on the right hand side of the bus and as I gazed out the window in darkness I didn't recognize anything. I just kept looking out that right side window and adamantly repeated that this wasn't my house. Rather than embarrass me, Sheridan went around the block and came around the opposite way to the same exact spot that he had stopped at before. However, now I was looking out at the opposite side of the same street, my house. See, I thought I was right all along. And then I realized as I looked out the other side of the bus that Sheridan had actually stopped at my house the first time. It was just that I was looking out at my across the street neighbor's house, which in the dark shadows of the night was unrecognizable to me. I didn't turn my head to see that my home lay just across the street. I remember feeling a sense of shame and embarrassment. I mean, how many hours a week did I ride this bus?

There was really no excuse for my mistake. But I recall that all of the kids, even the older ones were very polite and understanding, saying it

could happen to anyone. How awesome of Sheridan not to embarrass me or force me off the bus. He simply drove around the block so that I could see my house out of my own window. Why do I remember this on Shavuot?

This vivid memory of Sheridan of someone helping me to see my way home even though it was right next to me all along. He took the extra time, even though it was late at night and everyone else on the bus needed to be home. Sheridan took the time to gently turn me around so that I could behold what was before me.

On Shavuot we discuss the giving of Torah. But in reality, we neglect to mention the most important process of all, in the giving of Torah. It is our teachers who have shown each and every one of us the Torah, it's meanings, it's nuances. It is our teachers who open our eyes to what is standing right before us, and without that gentle nudge, or perhaps a stern voice we would never find our way home.

So, why is it Shavuot, called the Occasion of the Giving of Our Torah,

Z'man Matan Torateinu, and not the Occasion of the Receiving of Our Torah? Rabbi Menachem of Kotzk taught the Giving of Torah took place in the month of Sivan, but the receiving of the Torah takes place every day.

Rabbi Menachem of Kotzk said further: The Giving of Torah was the same for everyone, but the receiving of Torah is different for each person according to his ability to understand.

I count Sheridan, our Talmud Torah of Minneapolis bus driver as one of my teachers. For he helped me according to my ability to understand. I count him as one of my teachers because he was such an integral part of our Hebrew School experience. The bus—who would have ever thought that our Hebrew School bus driver could have taught me that the Receiving of Torah takes place every day. And I'll add to the Kotzker Rebbe's statement.

It often takes a great teacher to make sure we are in the right position to receive it!

News from the President

On Sunday, June 8, I attended a meeting hosted by the Rochester Area Synagogue Presidents (RASP) Council. For nearly two years, the area synagogue presidents have been meeting to get to know one another, to plan and submit grant submissions, and to serve as sounding boards to one another as we serve our congregations.

This meeting shared the results of a community survey completed via a Farash Foundation grant to the RASP Council. This grant's purpose is to seek ways for synagogues to collaborate, as community partners, for Jewish engagement (affiliated or not). This meeting included presidents, presidents-elects, immediate past presidents, clergy and was facilitated by Rabbi Lou Feldstein, CEO of Dynamic Change Solutions and our consultant for this process. Neal Eckhaus, who is also representing TBD, and Rabbi Smookler attended as well.

The information presented at the meeting was gathered by Rabbi Feldstein during individual meetings with each participating temple, its president (and president-elect) last month. As one participant at the meeting said, the report is a mirror showing us what our community looks like. Did everyone agree with everything presented? As you would expect, the answer is no. The report is a snapshot ... representing the opinions, knowledge and insights of people on a given day. Rabbi Feldstein advised us to not jump into community programming just yet; we need more time to build layers of knowledge and understanding first.

Some of the demographic information separates Rochester from national trends. Our Jewish community is older (we have fewer 20 and 30 somethings),

and features a higher percentage of married/living with a partner, home ownership and synagogue affiliation. The RASP Council has agreed to move to Phase 2, in which Rabbi Feldstein will work to validate the information and shared impressions, and will meet with each synagogue's board to gather information, build investment in this process, and provide insights that can help each congregation. Phase 2 will end with a community-wide synagogue board training event (likely in September) that will leave our Council and each synagogue prepared to move forward to an implementation phase.

A facilities committee has met to discuss a likely move for our temple. We have no timeline, but hope that this is an efficient process. We have begun the process of getting an appraisal of our property, looking at locations and buildings that could serve as a future home for Temple, as well as discussing our anticipated space needs. Please be sure that as soon as we have information or potential plans we will have a congregational meeting.



In addition to the RASP meetings, Rabbi and I, together or individually, have met with community leaders about Temple Beth David. We are sharing our excitement as we look forward for our congregation.

Most important in this is that we do this ourselves, for ourselves. This is an exciting time to be President and to be a member of this amazing community.

And, the success of our community is because of our members, our leadership, our Rabbi, and our friends in the Rochester community.

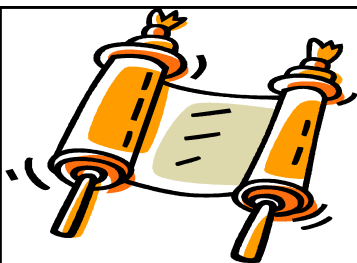
