We are not the first Jews, nor the last, to heed the call to cross over – into a world of engaged and passionate Torah learning, meaningful prayer, and compassionate service to all of God's creations. In many ways, this particular journey and this specific destination are becoming one.

Passion helps us overcome the fear of change, and the uncer-

I bless that when we pray together, we engage each other's inner beings -- we experience incremental healing with each word, -- and we merge into a sensitized awareness of our unity of existence.

Gemilut hasadim, the giving of loving-kindness, helps us mirror God's Presence in the world. When we bring understanding, empathy, love, or tangible help to another person, we fulfill our highest ideals as human beings. When we relate to one another with compassion, we honor and respect that aspect of humanity that reflects the image of God.

I bless that we embrace the Talmudic principle of *kvod habriot* in preserving the dignity of all people. When we enter into new territory -- such as ushering a new rabbi into our lives -- we cross over into an unknown dynamic and a new beginning. Even though *Rashi*, the eleventh century French Torah commentator said, "*all beginnings are difficult*," we can smooth over the bumps -- by honoring the blessings of the past, respecting the preciousness of the present moment, and praying for a peaceful, prosperous, and harmonious future.

I bless that we honor the memory and teachings of our beloved rabbis, teachers, and mentors. I bless that we listen to one another, even when we disagree, and I bless that we proceed surely and confidently to build a holy community and serve God with love.

I bless that when we cross over into our new lives -- together -- we see each other's strengths -- and infinite possibilities.

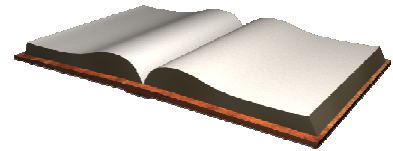

News from the Kitchen

This delicious “cheesy bake” (sometimes elevated to “soufflé” status by our more enthusiastic congregants) was served at the brunch to honor Rabbi Goldberg. We have received several requests for the recipe.

Cheesy Bake

You can add sautéed vegetables like onions, mushrooms, broccoli, sweet or hot peppers and/or plum tomatoes right in the batter before baking. You could probably take out two or three of the egg yolks without anyone noticing. This recipe is nicely complemented by salsa, and can be served at any temperature – hot, warm, room temperature, or even cold.

Ingredients:

4 T. butter (1/2 a stick) melted in a 9 x 13 baking pan in the pre-heating oven
8 eggs
1 t. baking powder
¾ C. flour
2 C. cottage cheese (low fat works fine, non-fat not so well)
3 C. shredded cheese, like sharp cheddar and/or Swiss. Can use some “reduced fat” cheese, but not all.

Directions:

Mix everything together in a bowl. Pour in the melted butter. Make sure the butter is not super hot or it will cook the eggs. Grease the pan by spreading the remaining little bit of butter in the pan around. Pour the egg and cheese mixture into the pan and bake at 375° for 30-40 minutes. It will be golden brown in the corners and cooked all the way through when it's done. You should be able to cut it in squares and serve it with a spatula.
