A Final Word....

La-kol z'man, ve-'eit le-khol-heifetz tahat ha-shamayim, "A season is set for everything, a time for every experience under the Heaven" (Kohelet 1:1).

It seems just like yesterday that I became Interim Rabbi of Temple Beth David, and now I am writing my last article for the Bulletin. I delivered my final words of reflection to the congregation over the weekend of June 21-22, but for those who could not be present I share some of them with you here.

It is not without sadness that my connection with the congregation will soon come to an end, and I know that the same sentiment is shared by many members. But like Kohelet's immortal words, a season is set for everything, and that season has served its purpose, for you and for me. I came to Temple Beth David during the time of deep mourning, following the untimely death of its beloved rabbi, Rabbi Laurence Skopitz, z"l, of twenty five years. If I have, in some small way, helped to bring the congregation out of its mourning to face the challenges of the present and the future, then my rabbinate with this wonderful synagogue will have served its purpose.

Before I moved to Rochester, I had heard about its fine Jewish commu-

nity. This I have found to be true, especially so in the case of Temple Beth David. A few weeks ago, at our Shavuot dinner, we honored the founder members of the Temple. Some of them spoke to us of the early days of the congregation which they helped to build. Their spirit, dedication, devotion to Jewish values and ideals lives on. Just as we should be proud of them, they, I hope, should be proud of those who have since joined this community and followed in their footsteps.

I am proud to have served this synagogue. It has been a privilege to lead your services, to preach and teach, to be with you in times of sickness and sorrow as well as occasions for celebration, to be available to offer advice and be an attentive ear, to have helped our B'nai Mitzvah through their rite of passage, and to be a presence in our Hebrew School. The caliber and dedication of many of our members has impressed me greatly. Just this past Shabbat I said to myself, at what other shul can one experience such a meaningful, accurate and esthetically edifying Torah reading? At what other shul can a mourner be sure of having a *minyan* at a *shivah* so as to recite Kaddish? At what other shul is it a such a joy to have our youngsters on the bimah during at the opening and closing of

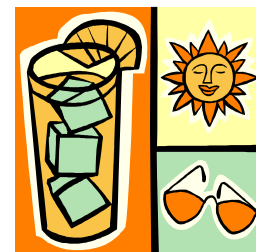

Our Founders

I am told that the Founders' dinner and program held on the eve of Shavuot on May 28 was very well received. Why might this have been so?

On reflecting, I think it is because of the touching contributions so many elders in our community made over 50 years ago and that a number of them continue to make.

In October 1953, seven families got together and envisioned that there could be a synagogue in Irondequoit. Not long after, there were 90 charter members who signed up. A year later there were 200 members of Temple Beth David. The name Temple Beth David was chosen in commemoration of the 3000th anniversary of King David's entry with the ark into Jerusalem.

Not long after the October 1953 meeting, Sisterhood was formed, and events sponsored by that organization were underway. In January 1954, Men's Club was organized, and additional events were populating the scene. A Sunday School was established in early 1954. How many children were enrolled? There were 150 children!

Pews were attached to the floor late at night to get the initial building underway. When the new synagogue – our

present edifice – was constructed, congregants' hands and hearts went into the construction. People donated time, money, and materials to make that happen.

What was touching on the evening of May 28 was the heart-felt recognition of those in our community who gave of themselves to make Temple Beth David come into being and become the warm community that it is today.

120 people attended our Founders' event, coming from as far as New England. People who hadn't seen each other in a while exchanged warm greetings and reminiscences.

As an icebreaker, there were trivia questions about the early years to get people connecting. A wonderful dinner was prepared by **Ellen Gertzog** with able help from **Marjory David, Gary Cohen, Bill Gertzog, and Joan Papkin**. Thank you to them! Also, thank you to the program committee of **Harry and Marilyn Goldberg, Gladys Garey, Florence Phillips, Mike Berke, Allison Helms, and Lois Markus!**

After the dinner, the program shifted from the social hall to the sanctuary. Here artful descriptions were given of the starting of Sisterhood by **Bess Koppen**, the early Sunday School years by

Golde Hersch, and the building of the synagogue by **Florence Phillips**. In turn, a panel of younger members then shared what they had gotten out of being members of Temple Beth David, what values they had picked up from the founders, and how they were playing out these values. **Hasse Halley**, Bess's daughter, spoke, **Stephen Papkin**, the son of **Joan and Jonathan Papkin**, expressed his heart-felt experiences, and **Lisa Klein** put into words the intangibles of being in a supportive, active community established by these early members.

Each founder was then recognized for his/her contributions and given a flowering plant, symbolizing the flowering of seeds they planted with their hard work. To conclude the program, **Sam Asher** led us in a rousing D'or V D'or, which means from generation to generation.

It is my prayer that the generations who inherited this synagogue from its founders continue making the needed contributions of time, hard work, money, and welcoming hearts that its founders did. These ingredients are needed to continue this synagogue as a warm, accepting, kind, and welcoming place where there is a sense of community, a vibrancy, and a love of Judaism.

the Ark and for Kiddush? At what other shul does the congregation sing with such beauty and enthusiasm, led by Cantor Asher's inspiring and uplifting tones? It is also most encouraging that the IHSC Hebrew School has gained in strength, quality, and sense of purpose, under the Principal, Marcy Berger.

I can honestly say that Temple Beth David has been one of the most positive experiences in my years in the congregation rabbinate. While "success" is an elusive word, and despite occasional set-backs, mistakes and disappointments, I know that I can apply this word to my rabbinate at Temple Beth David.

Success as an *Interim* rabbi, well, that is another story. If the role of the *Interim* Rabbi is supposed to be more

one of a caretaker, keeping a distance from the day-to-day activities of the congregation and the lives of the members, then I have probably been a resounding failure! I failed the moment when I could no longer speak about "you," but about "us," when Temple Beth David was no longer "your congregation" but "our congregation," when I felt part of the synagogue family.

Even though I have been with Temple Beth David for "but a season," I will look back on Temple Beth David with great warmth and pride. Warmth, because the congregation has been so welcoming. Pride, because the congregation has provided the opportunity and stimulus for my personal growth. If I am a better rabbi and human being, it is in no small measure because of the mutually enriching experience at Temple

Beth David. I hope that I have brought honor to the Torah, helped to bring you closer to the Torah, and deepened a sense of gratitude for the priceless gift of being Jewish.

I have every confidence in the future of this congregation. Even though it has still to make some hard decisions, it has so much going for it. Alas, I will not be with you on your journey, but I will remain with you in spirit. I wish you well and every success with your new rabbi, Rabbi Aviva Berg.

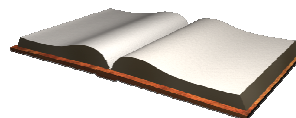

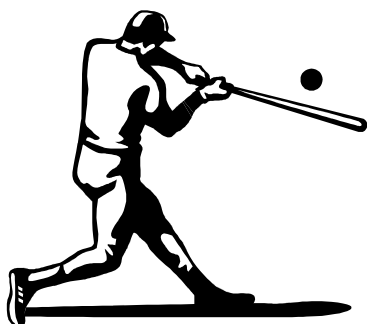

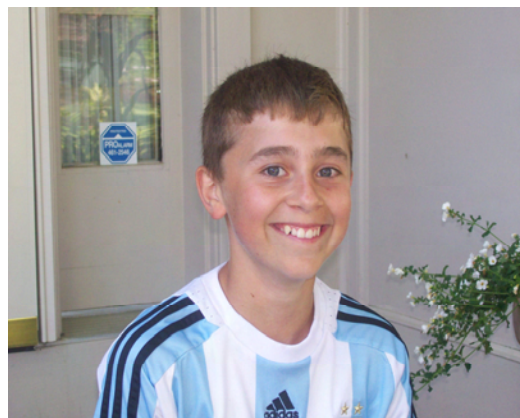
